**GENERAL ORDER XXXVI** 

**SUBJECT:** MISSING CHILDREN'S POLICY

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** 07-23-08 **REVIEW DATE:** 03-01-2015

**NOTE:** This rule or regulation is for internal use only and does not enlarge an officer's civil or criminal liability in any way. It should not be construed as the creation of a higher standard of safety or care in an evidentiary sense, with respect to third party claims. Violations of this directive, if proven, can only form the basis of a complaint by this department and then only in a non-judicial administrative setting.

I. Policy Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish guidelines and responsibilities regarding this agency's response to reports of missing children.

II. Policy Statement

A. It shall be the policy of this agency to thoroughly investigate all reports of missing children. Additionally this agency holds that every child reported as missing will be considered **at risk** until significant information to the contrary is confirmed.

B. Jurisdictional conflicts are to be avoided when a child is reported missing. If a missing child either resides in, or was last seen in this jurisdiction, this agency will immediately initiate the required reporting process. If a child resides in this jurisdiction and was last seen in another jurisdiction, but the law enforcement agency covering that jurisdiction chooses not to take a missing child report, this agency will assume reporting and investigate responsibility

C. Questions concerning parental custody occasionally arise in relation to missing child reports. It shall be the policy of this agency to accept the report of a missing child even if custody has not been formally established. Reporting parties shall be encouraged to obtain legal custody as soon as possible; however, since the safety of the missing child (children) is paramount, members of this agency will open a case when it can be shown that the child has been removed, without explanation, from his or her usual place of residence.

III. Definitions

A. The term **missing child** refers to a person who is

- 1. Younger than 18 years of age and
- 2. Whose whereabouts are unknown to his or her parent, guardian, or responsible party.
- B. A missing child will be considered "at risk" when one or more of the unusual circumstances noted in paragraph C are present.
- C. The term **unusual circumstances** refers to a missing child who is:
- 1. 13 years of age or younger.
- 2. Believed to be one or more of the items noted below:
- a. Out of the zone of safety for his or her age, development stage, and/or physical condition.
- b. Mentally diminished.
- c. Drug dependent, including both prescription and illicit substances.
- d. A potential victim of foul play.
- e. In a life-threatening situation.
- f. Absent from home for more than 6 hours before being reported to law enforcement as missing.
- g. Believed to be with others who could endanger his or her welfare.
- h. Is absent under circumstances inconsistent with established patterns of behavior. Or
- 3. Whose disappearance involves circumstances that would cause a reasonable person to conclude that the child should be considered at risk.
- D. Actions upon determination of unusual circumstances
- 1. If it is determined that **unusual circumstances** are involved in the report of a missing child, the child will be considered **at risk** and an expanded investigation, including the use of all appropriate resources, will immediately commence.
- 2. If appropriate, existing interagency response protocols including the **AMBER Alert** system, if available should be activated.
- IV. Procedures
- A. Communication personnel receiving the report shall
- 1. Promptly dispatch an officer to the scene of the report.
- 2. Notify a supervisor.
- 3. Transmit the appropriate radio alerts and other notifications.

- 4. Search agency records for related information
- 5. Safeguard all pertinent records.
- 6. Initiate media contact including activation of the **AMBER Alert** system and/or other immediate, community-notification methods when appropriate.
- B. The initial officer or first responder assigned to the report of a missing child shall
- 1. Determine if circumstances of the report meet the definition of a missing child set for in Section III.
- 2. Respond promptly to the scene of the report.
- 3. Interview the parent(s) or person who made the report.
- 4. Obtain a description of the missing child including photograph(s) and Videotapes.
- 5. Verify that the child is in fact missing.
- 6. Confirm the child's custody.
- 7. Identify the circumstances of the disappearance.
- 8. Determine when, where and by whom the missing child was last seen.
- 9. Interview the individual(s) who last had contact with the missing child.
- 10. Identify the child's zone of safety for his or her age, development stage, And physical and mental state.
- 11. Make an initial determination of the type of incident.
- 12. Obtain a description of the suspected abductor(s) and other pertinent Information.
- 13. Determine the correct NCIC Missing Person File category and ensure that a notification is promptly transmitted.
- 14. Provide detailed descriptive information to communications unit for Broadcast updates.
- 15. Identify and interview everyone at the scene.
- 16. Conduct a thorough search of the scene.
- 17. Secure and safeguard the area as a potential crime scene.
- 18. Record if the child has access to an online computer, cellular phone, and/or pager.
- 19. Prepare necessary reports and complete appropriate forms.
- C. The **supervisor** assigned to the report of a missing child shall
- 1. Obtain a briefing from the first responder(s) and other agency personnel at the scene.
- 2. Determine if additional personnel and resources are needed to assist in the investigation. (Consider contacting FBI)

- 3. Consider activation of the **AMBER Alert** system and/or other immediate community notification methods.
- 4. Establish a command post.
- 5. Organize and coordinate search efforts.
- 6. Ensure that all required notifications have been made.
- 7. Establish a liaison with the victim family.
- 8. Confirm that all agency policies and procedures are observed.
- 9. Manage media relations.
- A. The investigator assigned to the report of a missing child shall
- 1. Obtain a briefing from agency personnel at the scene
- 2. Verify the accuracy of all descriptive information.
- 3. Conduct a neighborhood investigation.
- 4. Obtain a brief history of recent family dynamics.
- 5. Explore the basis for conflicting information.
- 6. Implement effective case management.
- 7. Evaluate the need for additional resources and specialized services.
- 8. Update descriptive information.
- 9. Monitor media relations.
- B. An officer assigned to the report of an **unidentified person**, whether living or deceased who appears to be a child shall,
- 1. Obtain a complete description.
- 2. Enter the unidentified child's description in the NCIC Unidentified Person File.
- 3. Utilize all available resources to aid in identification of the child.
- 4. Cancel all notifications after identification is confirmed.
- C. An officer assigned to the recovery of return of a missing child shall

- 1. Verify that the located child is, in fact, the reported missing child.
- 2. Secure intervention services, if needed.
- 3. Arrange, in the case of a runaway or missing child from within the department jurisdiction who has been located and who is not wanted on a warrant or other law violation, the return of the child to his or her legal guardian or an appropriate children's shelter.
- 4. In the case of a runaway from another jurisdiction or from out-of-state who has been located and for whom a warrant exists or for whom an NCIC missing person "hit" is verified, place the child in custody and transport him or her to the appropriate facility for processing.
- 5. Complete the appropriate supplemental reports and cancel all outstanding notifications.

Note: In some cases a Missouri Endangered Person Advisory may be completed.

- 1. LOCAL AMBER ALERT Issue a local AMBER or SARAA alert. If you do not have access to a local alert system, skip this step.
- 2. NCIC ENTRY Make a NCIC missing person entry using the child abduction (CA) flag through the law enforcement computer system available in your area (MULES, REGIS, ALERT, etc.)
- 3. SCREEN AGAINST CRITERIA Verify that ALL of the following MISSOURI AMBER ALERT abduction criteria have been met:

### Check all that apply:

Law enforcement officials have reasonable belief that an abduction has occurred, which meets the definition in RSMo. 565.110 or 565.115.

Law enforcement officials believe that the child is in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or death.

Enough descriptive information exists about the victim and the abductor for law enforcement to issue an AMBER Alert.

The victim of the abduction is a child age 17 years or younger.

The child's name and other critical data elements - including the child abduction (CA) flag - have been entered into the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) system.

Note: Parental disputes do not apply unless a possibility of harm to the child has been determined.

Make sure you complete and fax all three (3) pages of this advisory form

1. SCREEN AGAINST CRITERIA - Verify the following MISSOURI AMBER ALERT abduction criteria to insure this missing person doesn't meet the AMBER ALERT criteria:

Law enforcement officials have reasonable belief that an abduction has occurred, which meets the definition in RSMo. 565.110 or 565.115.

Law enforcement officials believe that the child is in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or death.

Enough descriptive information exists about the victim and the abductor for law enforcement to issue an AMBER Alert.

The victim of the abduction is a child age 17 years or younger.

IF ALL OF THE ABOVE CRITERIA ARE PRESENT SUBMIT AN AMBER ALERT ABDUCTION FORM IMMEDIATELY.

2. If the missing person criteria don't meet ALL of the AMBER ALERT criteria, SCREEN AGAINST THE ENDANGERED PERSON ADVISORY CRITERIA.

Do the circumstances fail to meet the criteria for an AMBER Alert? (If they do meet the criteria for an AMBER Alert, immediately follow the protocol to issue an AMBER Alert)

Is the person missing under unexplained, involuntary, or suspicious circumstances?

Is the person believed to be in danger because of age, health, mental or physical disability, environment or weather conditions, in the company of a potentially dangerous person or some other factor that may put the person in peril?

Is there information that could assist the public in the safe recovery of the missing person?

- 3. NCIC ENTRY Make a NCIC missing person entry using the Endangered Missing EME code through the law enforcement computer system available in your area (MULES, REGIS, ALERT, etc.)
- 4. IF ALL OF THE ENDANGERED PERSON ADVISORY CRITERIA ARE MET COMPLETE THIS FORM AND FOLLOW THE INSTUCTIONS BELOW.
